There will be people at the aquarium that I need to share the space with. When we buy tickets at the entrance, I will stay close to my adult.



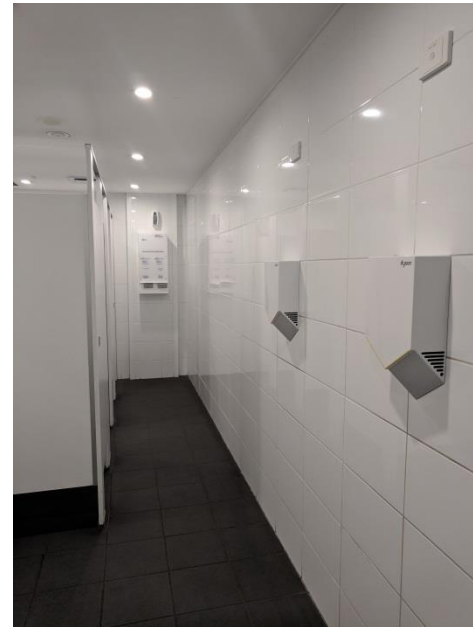
I may have to wait and line up before entering. I will be asked if I want to take a photo.



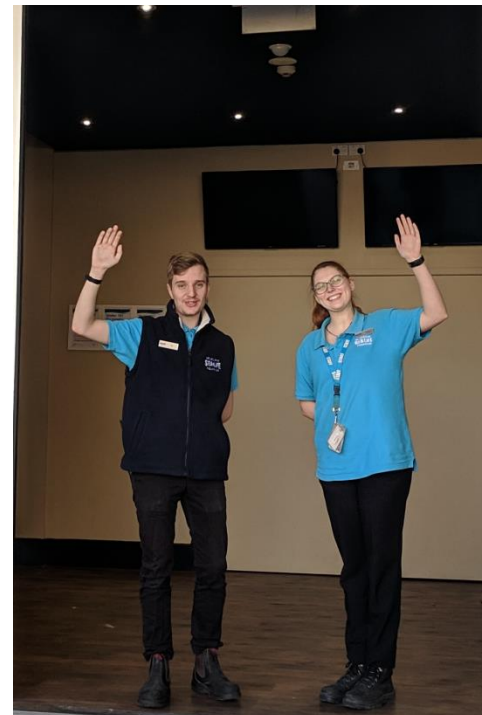
Some of the animals are big, some are small. They are all behind glass so I can get very close and be safe.



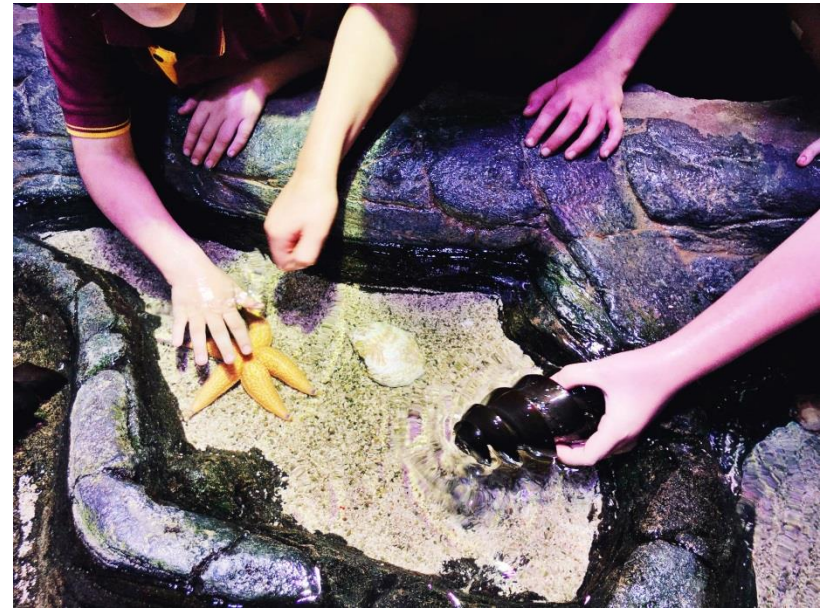

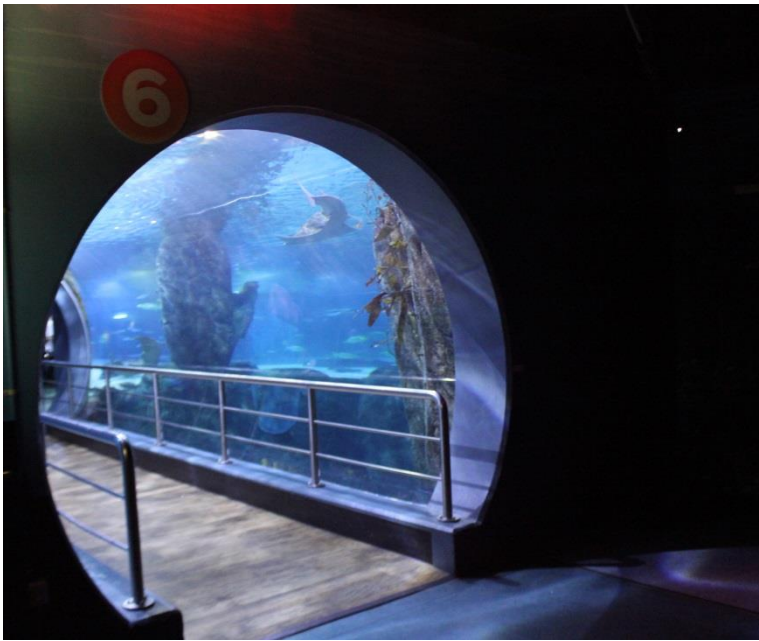
