Travel Advice for Visitors to Scheveningen

Great to hear that you're planning to visit Scheveningen! On sunny days, there is always a good chance of many people picking Scheveningen as their destination. Here's a bit of a travel advice that will allow you to get to Scheveningen quickly and without any fuss, so you can enjoy sun, sea, and beach.

Are you coming from The Hague or surrounding area?

- Enjoy a care-free journey with your (shared) bicycle, cargo bicycle or scooter. Please find more information about shared transport on this website.
- Or travel by public transport. During July and August, HTM runs according to a summer timetable, and there is a more frequent tram service to Scheveningen.

Are you coming from outside of The Hague or surrounding area?

- During the summer, there are multiple tramlines leaving for Scheveningen from the stations Hollands Spoor and Den Haag Centraal. These tram services go regularly and until late in the evening. Buses drive to the coast from the station Laan van NOI. An overview of all transport options may be found on this website.
- Or use Park + Beach; Park your car in a parking garage in the city and travel to Scheveningen by tram or bicycle in 15 minutes. The rates are quite affordable: € 5.00 for 24-hour parking, including tram or bicycle. This amount only includes the driver. Every other passenger (maximum of 4 persons) pays € 1.00. Children under 4 travel with you free of charge. You can book the parking spot beforehand, so you'll know exactly what you can expect. Check out www.park-beach.nl for more info.
- Determined to park in Scheveningen itself? The roads leading into Scheveningen can be very busy on sunny days, so chances are that you'll get stuck in traffic and won't find any available parking spaces. So please come as early as possible (before 10.00 a.m.) and use one of the parking garages. This website will give you an overview of the parking garages and the number of parking spaces still available.
- Please do not park in the residential areas. You may leave your car there only briefly (60-120 minutes max.) and there is strict enforcement during the summer. Even your first parking ticket may be accompanied by a wheel clamp.
